"Not the Church, not the State, Women must decide their Fate"

Read the sign carried by 5 UUVC Voices for Justice advocates, at the Pro-Reproductive Rights March at the Arkansas Capitol in Little Rock. This March came on the heels of a "Lobbying for Justice" workshop led by Kristin Foster of Citizens First Congress, and Anaïs Troadec. In preparation for the workshop, 12 Voices members met over food and wine, to discuss the six issues that are addressed by our social justice effort.

The workshop focused on "power-mapping"; the identification of all influences that give power to legislators and how to address these influences. *Voices* members are now being mobilized to contact our legislators, Senator Bill Sample and Representative Richard McGrew on such issues as taxes, redistricting and education. Bill Sample has not responded to us, but we have many email responses from Richard McGrew. Meeting them in person is the next step.

The Governor will soon call a Special Session to address taxes. We fear that other issues will be brought up, such as abortion, voting rights and election fraud.
