The histories we love to teach are often distorted, to the point that they would be unrecognizable to the people who actually lived through them.

Teaching the truth can make us unequivocally aware of our personal duty to help keep the dark history from ever repeating itself.

Confronting the facts of our history will not leave us feeling that we are part of the problem, but rather part of the solution. As Mychel Denzel Smith reminds us, a culture that shuts out parts of its identity is in danger of disintegrating into myth.

Truth engenders empathy which our world needs now more than ever. And with truth comes healing.

Treasurer's Report Kim Townsan

Net income through January 31 was \$24,543. This positive variance reflects expenses that were \$22,166 lower than budget. One major factor contributing to lower expenses is the \$7,000 included in the budget for the engagement of a live streaming service. Currently the church is doing this by way of Zoom. This is managed by a small group of members who are using their phones during the service to host the Zoom session.

Reports of contributions made to UUVC during calendar year 2021, that may be needed for your tax preparation, will be found in the Community Hall. The budget for our next fiscal year will be initiated in March. The process begins with input from each Committee. The proposed budget is presented to the Finance Committee for approval and then moves to the UUVC Board for their approval. The last step is approval by the membership at the UUVC Annual Meeting, to be held on Sunday, May 1.

Almost every Sunday, before and after the service, there is someone from the Green Team selling Equal Exchange products in the community hall. In fact, the coffee provided by the church is from Equal Exchange. But what is it exactly?

In 1986, three young entrepreneurs started importing coffee directly from a grower in Nicaragua. That was the first of many relationships between farmers from many countries and the little company that wanted to mutually benefit farmers and consumers. All their products are fair trade, almost all are organic, and Equal Exchange is a cooperative, owned by its workers.

The products the Green Team sell are bought at wholesale prices, and sold at that price, with no markup. The goals are to provide our congregation with Fair Trade food at fair prices, and to support those farmers involved in the cooperative.

Here's what you'll find at the coffee cart: several kinds of coffee (regular, decaf, whole bean and ground); 6 different teas (chamomile, ginger, English breakfast tea, black, green and hibiscus); 2 kinds of chocolate bars; cocoa mix; locally produced (Richard's) honev.
